The Belarus Road Map to Europe = the Road to Democracy?

Belarus is on the threshold to changes. After 15 years of isolation, the invitation of Belarus from the European Union to join the Eastern Partnership could bring Belarus into a process of much needed reforms. Alexander Lukashenko was personally invited to participate in the official opening of the Eastern Partnership program in Prague on May 6 and 7. At the same time, there are still no evident signs on the ground in Belarus indicating Lukashenkos willingness to ease his authoritarian fist.

At the seminar we will ask prominent members of the Belarusian opposition parties and other parts of the civil society about what they think about the European invitation of President Lukashenko, and in which direction is Belarus moving.
