In 2021 and 2022, "Letters from Lukashenka's Prisoners" aimed to provide unjustly detained individuals - Belarusian political prisoners' voices - by collecting, translating, and publishing their letters. This campaign was first organised in 2021 as a collaborative project by Belarus Free Theatre, Index on Censorship, Human Rights House Foundation, and Politzek.me.
